Because of his good influence upon so many churches, including the Southside church, I write this tribute to the legacy he has left. May we be encouraged by the good influence he has had upon us through the years.

Family

R.J. and Pauline were married for 65 years. They were blessed with three children. Joseph and his wife, Marsha, live in Pampa, TX. He is an elder of the congregation they worship with, and as might be expected, is an excellent song leader in that congregation. Tim and his wife, Vicki, live in Kemp, TX, and for a number of years Tim has been serving as an elder of the church there, along with R.J. Tim has also followed in the footsteps of his father in preaching and in teaching and conducting singings and singing schools across this country. Tim has worked with us the last ten years in our singings and held us a meeting a couple of years ago. R.J. and Pauline also had one daughter, Paula, who is married to Rich Ladd, and they live in Roseville, CA. Rich is an elder in the church in Folsom, CA. His Work

R.J. preached the gospel for 65 years. The last 30 years, while living at Kemp, he has been in full time Gospel Meeting and Singing School work. He has also directed singing in lectureships and in singings over much of the nation, such as the one we have the third Friday night of each January.

He also directed the Oklahoma Singing School on the campus of the college at Wilburton, OK for a number of years. People would gather from all over the country to spend a week of intensive music study and singing. Tim, Dane Shepard and others assisted in the teaching in that school. I have seen the good fruits in many churches where I have visited. For instance, I have visited the small church in Bradley, AR twice this year, and 2 young men have led the singing and did such a quality job it was obvious they had been to the Wilburton school.

Most of us really have no idea of how much good R.J. has done in many churches throughout our nation in improving the singing among churches of Christ. I have seen much evidence of it. Also, someone has said, "R.J. taught us how to worship, not just sing." And I know that he has helped us to know how to sing and worship here at Southside.

Our Annual Singing

R.J. will be missed at our eleventh annual singing the third Friday night January 18th. Tim Stevens, Dane Shepard and Todd Dennis are an important part of the legacy R.J. has left. They will be leading our singing again this January. There are a number of other song leaders that R.J. has influenced who lead in other singings in many places in Texas and a number of other states. These good brethren will continue to build the legacy started by R.J. "He being dead, yet speaks" is so true.

We believe that angels have carried R.J.'s spirit to "Abraham's bosom" (paradise). Let's follow the good example of R.J. Stevens as he followed Jesus Christ, so that we can sing with him and all the redeemed throughout eternity!
