E very congregation with which I have ever been associated has a fine number of devout women in its membership. Women are a vital part of the church. Their talents and expertise must be put to good use for the good of the church. Their faith and good works are acceptable to the praise and glory of God almighty.

Scripture declares that women are equal to men before God as far as salvation is concerned (Gal. 3:28). Neither sex has advantage over the other when it comes to faithful obedience which makes one a child of God. Both males and females have equal access to God as their Father. Women have just as much responsibility to worship and serve God as men. But their roles are different, and we must respect the God-appointed differences.

Men have been given responsibility for leading the church of Christ. New Testament examples, commands, and inferences all point to the fact that males are to be the elders, deacons, and preachers in the church of God (1 **Tim. 3; Titus 1).** Yet, male leadership does not detract from the importance and indispensability of women in a local church. Young or old, all women have a vital role to play.

What would the Bible say a woman should do in the kingdom of God? There are many scriptural things a woman contributes —

She can labor in the Gospel by teaching other women who need to become Christians (**Phil. 4:3**).

- She can teach other women and children who need to be edified or evangelized (**Titus 1:3-5**). In fact, she can do these things better than most men could ever do them.
- She can provide hospitality for Christians and non-Christians, like Lydia (Acts 16:15). Men are not naturally as adept or skilled in this area.
- She can lead others to seek the Lord by her meek, kind, and exemplary life (1 Pet. 3:1-6). Just where would many men have been spiritually unless their wives influenced them for good?
- She can encourage and help a Gospel preacher in his work like Priscilla did for Apollos (Acts 18:26). Many women aided the Lord in His work (Matt. 27:55-56). Most preachers have relied heavily on sisters in Christ for assistance, advice, and aid.
- She can "*diligently follow every good work*" (1 Tim. 5:10) by bringing up children, caring for the sick, cooking meals for shut-ins, or providing transportation for the poor. These are essential functions, which, if undone, cause families, churches, and society to unravel.
- She can be a godly homemaker and mother, which is her distinct calling in life (1 Tim. 5:14). A homemaker is a noble work. A mother is far more than

a biological role. Raising a child to love the Lord is no small work (2 **Tim. 1:5).** Just ask Eunice and Lois!

• She can pray fervently like Mary, the mother of Jesus and the other women who were disciples (Acts 1:14). Fervent praying from our sisters may have done more good than public prayers offered by men.

Perhaps you can add to this scriptural list of "women's work." It is amazing how much work New Testament women were assigned by the Holy Spirit. Modern women have more to do than they can get done in the service of Christ, if only they would see how vital they are to the work of the church. Men who either ignore the contributions of women or who act as if they are second-class should repent of their sin against our sisters.

Every congregation owes a great debt to our godly sisters who faithfully shoulder their spiritual responsibilities. Just where would any congregation be without the sacrificial spirit of women throughout their history? We salute our beloved women who model Christ before us and who do so much to make the church such a pleasant and complete family of God. —*Midweek Messenger 4/14/21*
